All students are learning how to use Seesaw. Seesaw empowers students to independently document their learning through a digital portfolio and provides an audience for their work—their peers, parents, or the world. Seesaw gives families an immediate and personalized window into their child's school day, helping to answer: "What did you do at school today?" Seesaw saves teachers time on organization and parent communication, makes formative assessment easy, and provides a safe place to teach 21st Century skills.

Once students have uploaded some items into their portfolios an invite will be sent home (next week) to parents/caregivers asking them to download the app or access the website and join. After joining you will only be able to see your own child's portfolio and you will also receive automatic notifications about new work.


### Friends of Tapora School Fundraising Committee
