Kia ora,

Welcome back to school and 2023. What a horrible start to another year weatherwise. At least our first two days have been lovely and we were very fortunate to not be affected by all the rain and flooding.

Welcome

As well as our students and staff from last year we also welcome Taimana in his first year at primary school who joins his brother Ariki in the junior class. We are also excited to have Sydney join us in the senior room. Sydney and her family come up from Pukekohe to the Rodney area. We know they will love their time at Tapora School.

Communication

At the start of the year I'd like to mention communication which is an extremely important part of the Parent - Teacher - School relationship. This newsletter is one method of communication but is only sent out fortnightly. In it we can let you know what is coming up and report on what has already happened but there are other instances where there is a need for more timely communication.

Most urgent situations will be dealt with via a phone call and so we need to have up to date emergency contact details if we are unable to get hold of the main caregiver. There will be a notice sent home soon outlining your current contacts and a request to update if necessary.

The main method of communication will be the use of the Skool Loop app. Everyone seems to have a smartphone these days so it shouldn't be difficult to download the app. The app provides everything you need: notices; facebook link; link to the most recent newsletter which you can print or share; in contacts you can phone, email or get to our website quickly; a calendar of school events that links to your own phone calendar and allows you to see if there are any clashes; absentee notices can be provided quickly and most importantly you can give your permission for your child to attend school events. ERO Review

ERO maintains a regular review programme to evaluate and report on the education and care of young people in the schools. Te Ara Huarau is the evaluation approach that the Education Review Office (ERO) started using in our school last year. This is a developmental approach to evaluation where ERO and schools work together over time rather than the one off reviews that happened previously every three years. Te Ara Huarau is used in most English -medium state and state-integrated schools.

Our school worked alongside ERO last year to write our Profile Report. This type of report will only happen once as part of our initial engagement with Te Ara Huarau. The profile report reflects our strategic goals and a shared evaluation focus on one or more areas that are important to us as we work together to improve outcomes for all our learners. ERO, like us, has a strong focus on equity and excellence. Future reporting will show our progress and achievement towards meeting the goals we have set. The Profile Report has been published on <u>ERO's website</u> along with the Board Assurance Report that shows how we are meeting regulatory and legislative Requirements.

Dental Services

The Auckland Regional Dental Service (ARDS) is a Te Whatu Ora operated service, which provides free dental care to children across the greater Auckland areas. In order to prevent any eligible children missing out on receiving free dental care, ARDS is cross-checking their own records with school rolls.
